A tasty new urban farm

We love seeing cornstalks sprouting up in the city. At **Bittersweet**, a 1950s gas station turned farm-to-table restaurant in the super-urban Wash Park neighborhood, that's just the beginning. Chef Olav Peterson creatively uses raised beds around the restaurant's perimeter, so he can harvest veggies and herbs from right outside and whip up dishes like stuffed squash blossoms, watermelon salad, and corn risotto. \$\$\$; *closed Sun;* 500 E.
